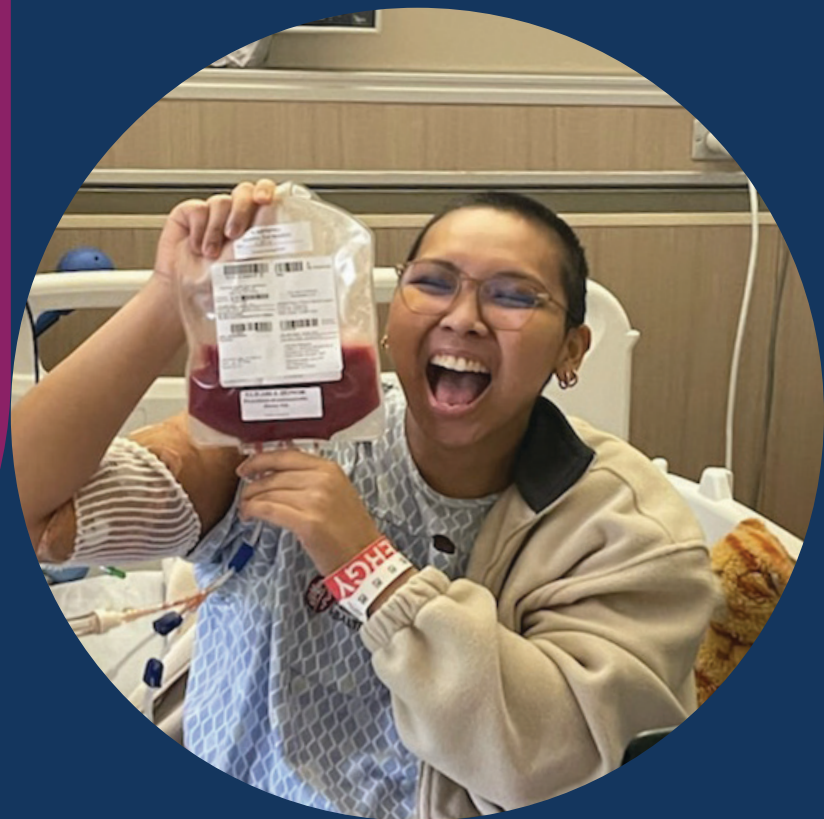

Built on love

From one transplant to worldwide hope

In 1979, 10-year-old Laura Graves received the first-ever unrelated donor blood stem cell transplant to treat leukemia—because her parents refused to accept it couldn't be done.

Her transplant didn't end the story. It ignited a movement.

Turning love into action, Laura's parents worked alongside physicians, leaders and elected officials to make the impossible repeatable. In 1987, their determination helped establish the first national registry of volunteer blood stem cell donors, creating the foundation for everything that followed.

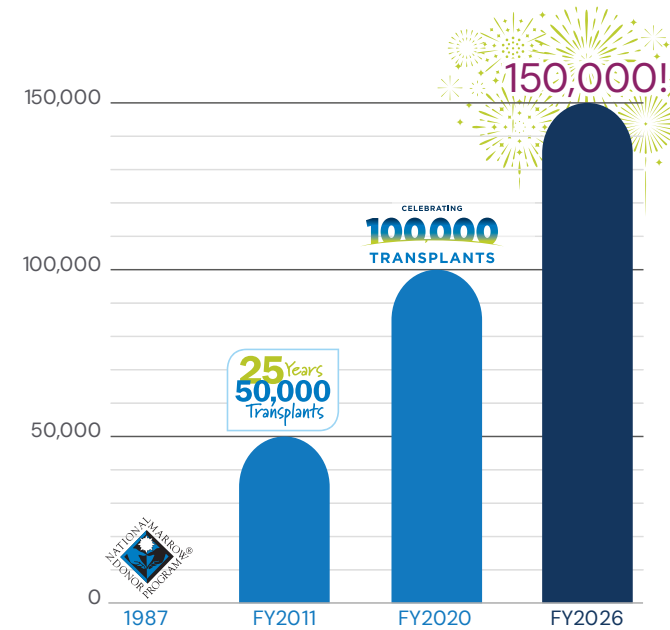
That foundation has grown stronger with every patient served, every donor match made and every barrier broken. **In 2026, we'll celebrate our 150,000th life impacted through cell therapy, a milestone once thought impossible.**

Impacting our first 100,000 lives took nearly 32 years. Our next 50,000 were realized in less than seven years.

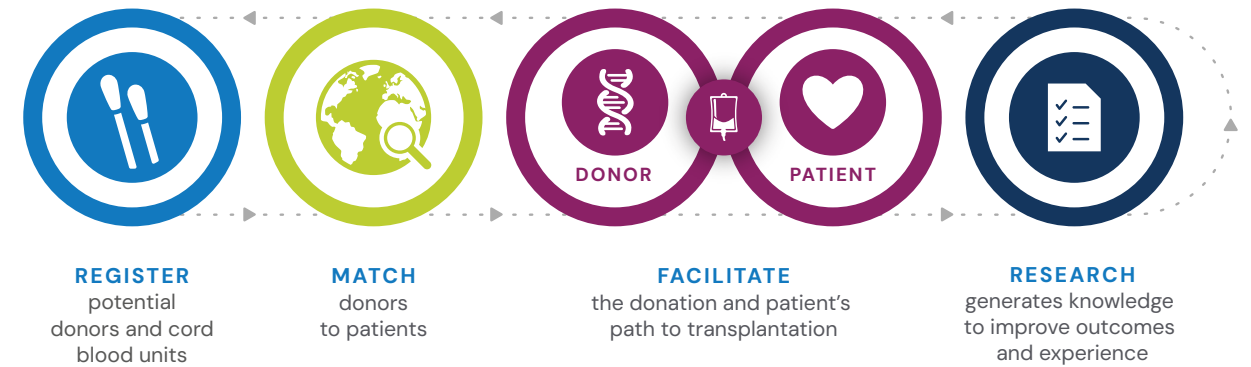
Equipped to deliver cures

NMDP is a pioneering nonprofit advancing cell therapy and transforming lives for people facing blood cancers and disorders.

With the help of blood stem cell donors from the world's most diverse registry and our extensive network of transplant partners, physicians and caregivers, we're expanding access to treatment so that every patient can receive their life-saving cell therapy.

Our mission spans the globe. We facilitate access to three sources of blood stem cells—peripheral blood stem cells and bone marrow through donor collections, and umbilical cord blood through trusted partnerships.

Designed for impact

This was a fiscal year of real progress. For the first time, we surpassed 8,000 lives impacted—a milestone powered by momentum and continued growth in mismatched unrelated donor (MMUD) transplants (see page 15). We exceeded our goal for 2025 and are now ahead of pace on our five-year plan—bringing us closer to reaching 10,000 lives annually by 2028.

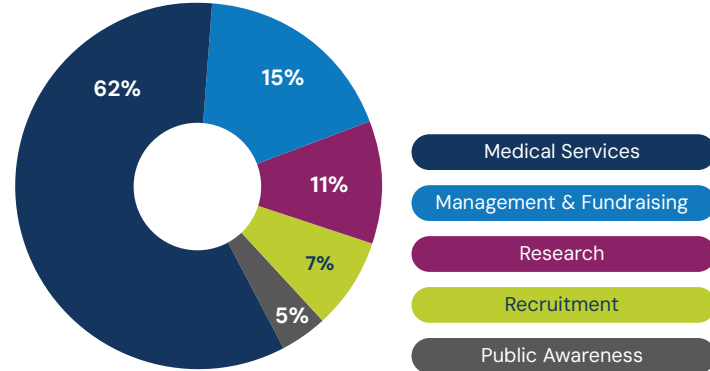

Investing in patients

\$100M campaign milestone achieved

In 2019, NMDP set an ambitious goal: raise \$100 million to remove barriers, accelerate research and help more patients receive their life-saving cell therapy. Thanks to thousands of supporters and our dedicated campaign committee, who went all in, that goal was surpassed—we raised **more than \$102 million**, and **we impacted more than 50,000 lives** in just six years.

This collective investment delivers where it matters most. Financial assistance helped ease the burden for patients like Donna, who had faced overwhelming out-of-pocket costs beyond her transplant, but can now focus on healing, not bills.

Through this campaign alone, we’ve delivered **\$39.1 million in patient financial assistance**, while investing **\$20 million in research** to expand access

through initiatives like Donor for All and **\$11.1 million to strengthen donor and registry support** worldwide. Together, these efforts represent a comprehensive approach: meeting patients’ urgent financial needs today while also building the scientific and systemic foundation of the future.

The success of this campaign reflects the power of philanthropy. “This \$100 million milestone belongs to every donor, partner and community member who joined this campaign,” said Erica Jensen, senior vice president, Strategy and Advancement. “It’s a reminder that NMDP is driving progress that helps patients live longer, healthier lives. This is not the finish line—it’s the foundation for innovative fundraising strategies that ensure the impact we’ve created won’t stop with this campaign but will continue to grow for years to come.”

Expanding access

Costs should never decide who lives and who gets left waiting.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we've strengthened systems and broken down barriers to ensure reliable access to transplant. Each day, we receive an average of 15 grant requests from patients needing help with transplant-related expenses like housing, transportation and prescription medications. Since 2019, we've delivered more than \$39.1 million in patient financial assistance. In 2025 alone, we provided just over \$7 million in grants to more than 3,400 patients.

Thanks to partners like Big Nova, this impact reaches even further. Their transformational \$3 million gift is expanding assistance for patients and donors alike—helping more patients move through transplant and more donors say “yes” when called. Inspired by a loved one's transplant, the family's generosity strengthened these systems and helped propel NMDP past our \$100 million campaign goal (see page 10).



When help becomes hope

Heaven received her transplant, and thanks to the extraordinary gift from Big Nova, she was also able to receive a post-transplant grant to cover critical expenses not covered by insurance. This support helped her through the hardest part of recovery and gave her hope that healing was possible.

Accelerating progress

Big goals need bold research.

Real progress takes more than hope—it takes innovation. Through NMDP’s **Donor for All** initiative, new research with **CIBMTR** shows that mismatched unrelated donor (MMUD) transplants, paired with post-transplant therapy, can deliver outcomes comparable to closer matches.

Utilization of MMUD increases the likelihood of identifying donors for all patients

Likelihood of finding donor with tissue type match of 6, 7 or 8 out of 8 key blood markers in five race/ethnic groups

8/8 match 7/8 match 6/8 match

The impact is clear: More patients can find donors, fewer are left waiting, and those searching will have a greater than **99% likelihood** of finding a suitable donor. Presented at the **American Society of Hematology Annual Meeting**, this work shows what sustained investment makes possible.

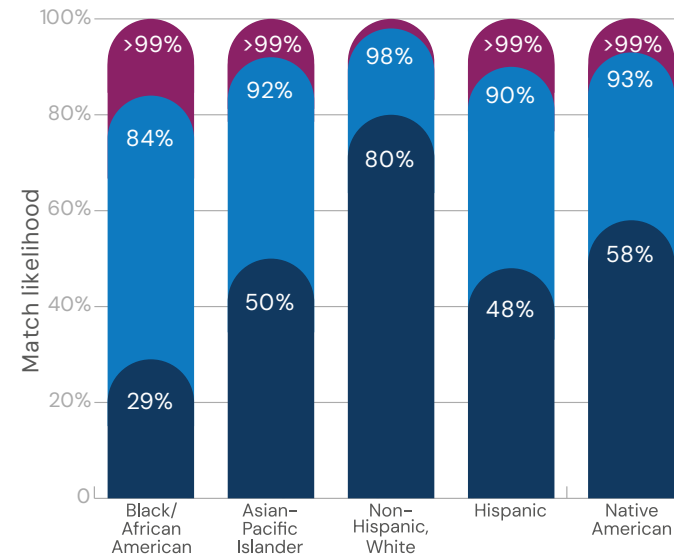

Investing in the next generation of innovators

Two early-career physician scientists received the **NMDP Amy Strelzer Manasevit Research Program** grant, and one pediatric nurse researcher received the **NMDP Barbara Buchbinder Nurse Research Program** grant. These awards, **funded entirely through philanthropy**, fuel discoveries that improve transplant outcomes.

Since 1998, the Amy Research Program has awarded **up to \$400,000 over five years** per scholar pursuing breakthroughs that reduce complications and help patients thrive after treatment. Now in its second year, the Buchbinder Nurse Research Program provides a **\$25,000 grant** supporting research to improve the transplant experience and outcomes for pediatric patients.

From research to real life

When science and compassion align, lives are transformed.

Nicole’s life changed in 2021 with a leukemia diagnosis—and the road to recovery would require extraordinary resilience. Over the next two years, she underwent **three blood stem cell transplants**, first from her sister, then her brother and finally from a mismatched unrelated donor she now calls her fourth sibling: Mariel. **Each transplant carried hope. Each also carried risk.**

After her third transplant, Nicole faced serious complications from graft-versus-host disease, threatening her quality of life and her future. For many patients, these complications can be severe and long-lasting—sometimes fatal. Yet with the support of her care team, her family and continued advances in transplant research, Nicole pushed through. **Today, she’s reclaiming the moments that once felt out of reach.** “Being able to explore the outdoors and enjoy the mundane moments is priceless,” she says. “I know I’m starting to be on the other side of it.”

Mariel’s journey began years earlier, when she joined the **NMDP Registry** after seeing a donor and recipient meet at the **HOSA – Future Health Professionals** conference. Two years later, she returned to that same conference to meet Nicole—the person her decision helped save. **“I never thought my background would connect me to another person in that way,”** Mariel said.

Nicole’s story reflects what’s possible when **donor generosity meets sustained scientific investment**. Initiatives like Donor for All, which looks at mismatched unrelated donors (see previous page), fuel discoveries that improve outcomes, reduce complications and help more patients **not only survive but truly thrive.**

World-class partner

Strategic leadership for global impact

This is how we move forward: aligning vision, investment and strategy to ensure more patients don't just reach transplant but thrive beyond it.

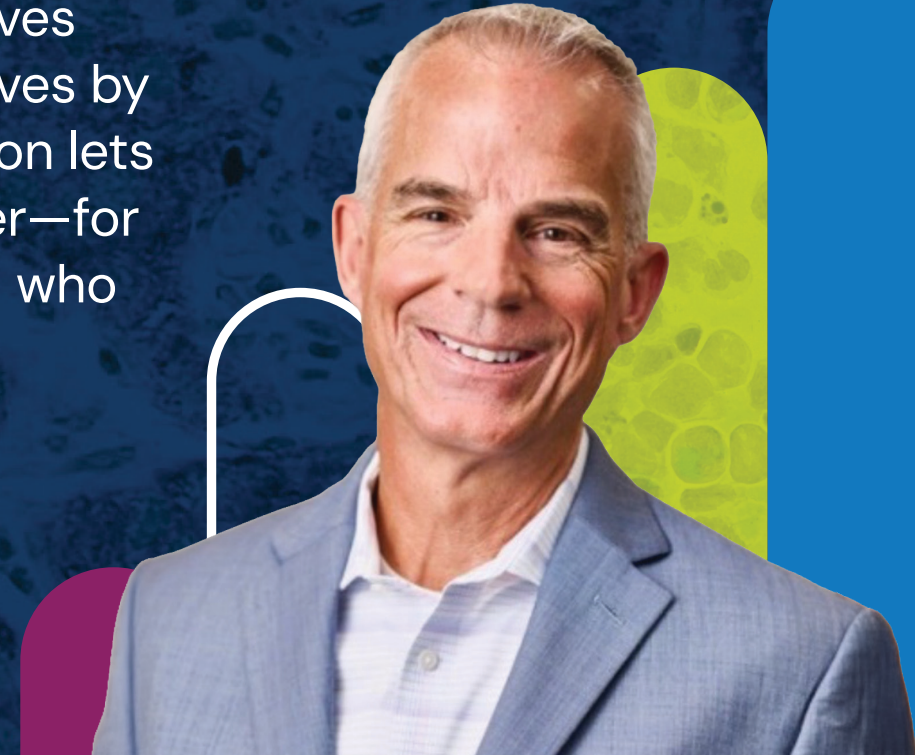

Under this vision, technology becomes a force multiplier: enabling efficiency, improving collaboration and helping our partners do more for the patients who depend on us—today and in the years ahead.

One choice, a lifetime of impact

How a stranger's yes gave Kelsey her childhood back

One person's decision can change a life. For Kelsey, that life-altering decision came from a stranger named Katrice.

Diagnosed with sickle cell disease shortly after birth, Kelsey faced years of chronic pain and infections. To help, her mom, Ebony, returned to nursing school and earned her master's degree as a nurse practitioner so she could give her daughter the strongest possible care.

There were years of pain crises, blood transfusions and hospital stays. Then in 2023, a donor match through the NMDP Registry gave Kelsey a second chance to be a kid. Last year, Kelsey and Ebony met Katrice live on "Good Morning America"—a powerful reminder of what one decision can make possible.

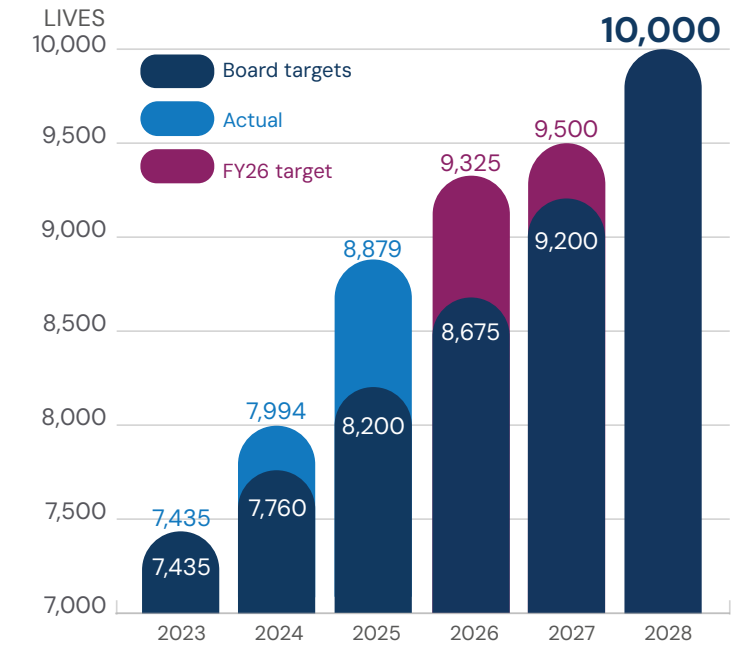

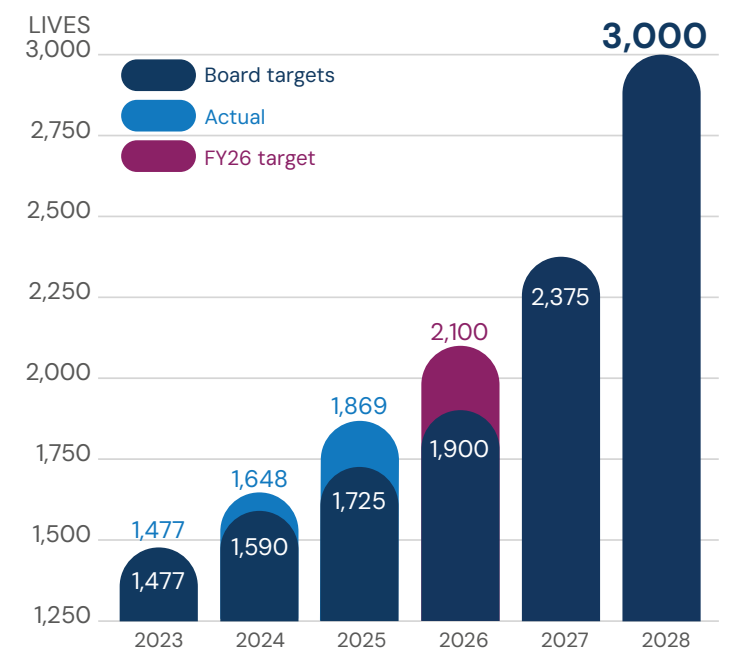
LIVES FIVE-YEAR PLAN

Because impact at scale needs believers at the table

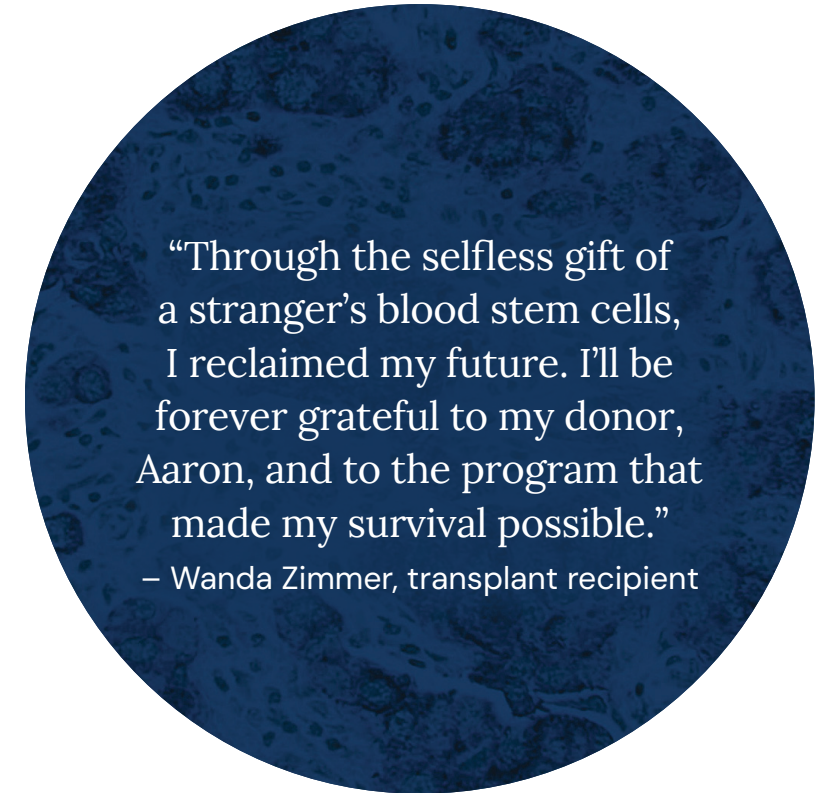

After a **blood stem cell transplant**, Wanda Zimmer emerged with more than a second chance—she emerged with purpose. Diagnosed with cancer more than two decades ago, Wanda faced the terrifying uncertainty of whether she would continue to be there for her children. What carried her through was hope—and the **selfless gift from a stranger**.

Matched through the NMDP Registry, Wanda received a transplant from her donor, Aaron, that brought renewed strength and possibility. Her experience informs the work she does today. As an advocate, financial contributor and recruiter, she shares her story to inspire action across communities and campuses. Her voice helps expand the donor registry, amplify awareness and remind others what's possible when science and compassion align.

In 2023, Wanda and her husband, Robert, transformed gratitude into action by establishing the **Zimmer Family Giving Back Hope Fund** to support patients and fuel progress. Wanda's journey is living proof that when hope meets action, **lives are changed—and futures are restored**.

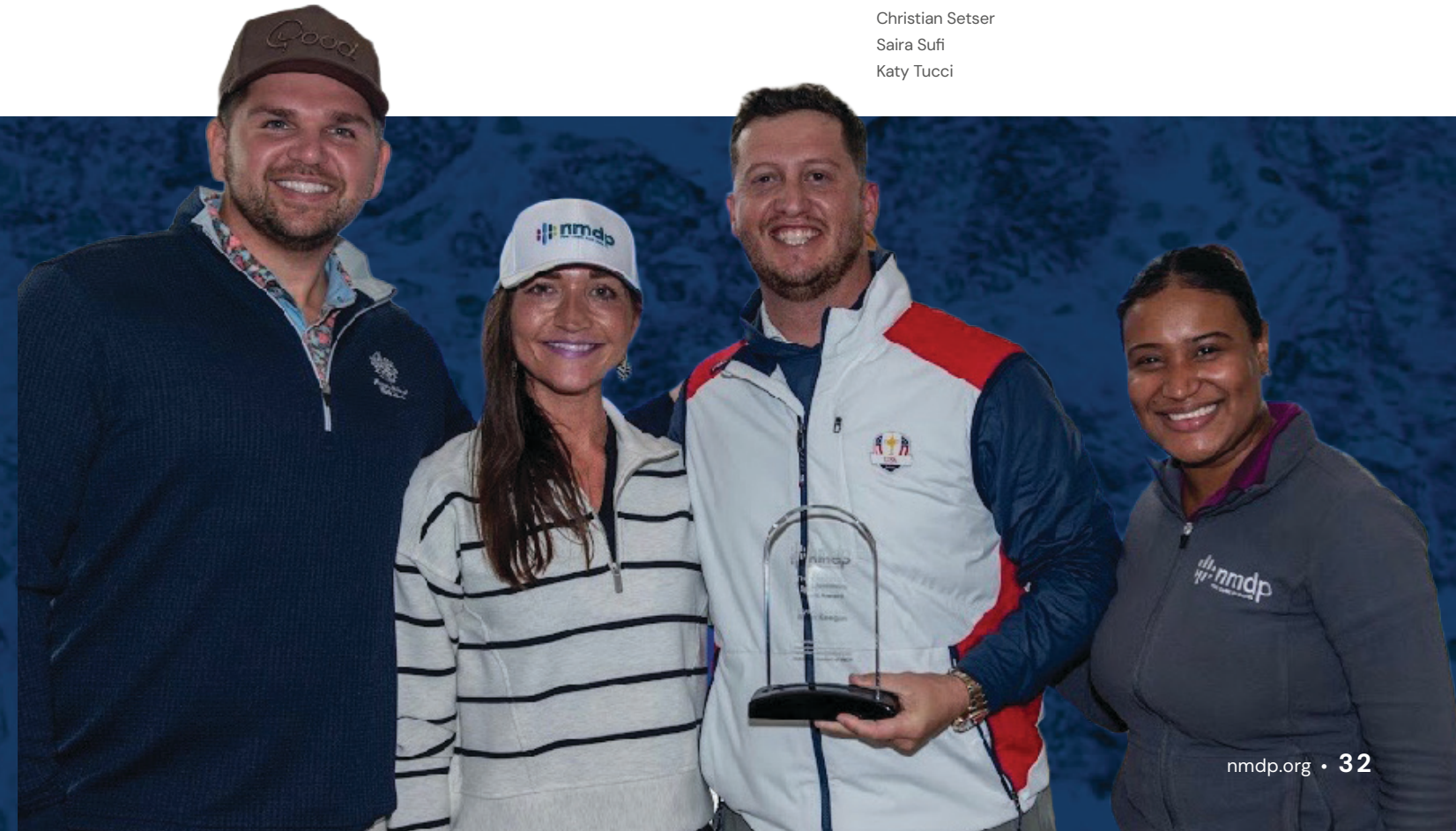
2025 Livermore Spirit Award winner
