From the moment a patient is diagnosed, we're there every step of the way. We create more opportunities for better outcomes. One way we do this is by providing patient assistance grants to help families cover out-of-pocket expenses related to transplant.

Since these grants became available, **667 patients in Florida** have received financial assistance totaling **\$1,540,045 to help more patients** go through the transplant process. Of these patients, **12% were children.**

- Since 1987, NMDP has facilitated more than 125,000 transplants. In 2023, NMDP impacted 7,435 lives through cell therapy.
- Today, patients have access to more than **41 million** potential donors worldwide.
- In 2023, NMDP provided **\$5.5 million** in patient assistance grants to more than **2,600 families**.

- Entrusted by Congress for 35+ years: Since the inception of the C.W. Bill Young Cell Transplantation Program (the national registry), Congress has authorized NMDP to oversee the program.
- NMDP finds cures and saves lives. NMDP manages the most diverse listing of potential donors in the world (the national registry).
- We treat and cure over 75 diseases through cell therapy.
- Accelerating Progress: Underscoring NMDP's commitment to expanding access to cell therapy, we recently published findings showing that using expanded matching criteria could result in a nearly three-fold increase in the likelihood of securing a suitable donor. This breakthrough dramatically increases the chances of finding a match on the national registry, offering cell transplantation as a viable, life-saving therapy, regardless of ancestry.

In April 2009, I was listening to "Being Alive" by Stephen Sondheim while waiting for lab results. When the doctor walked in, I hit pause, and he delivered a diagnosis of chronic myelogenous leukemia.

"Being Alive" was perhaps the perfect song for that moment. It can be interpreted in many ways. I see it as meaning life is beautiful, messy, complex and full of challenges.

Luckily, I like irony, appreciate sarcasm and adore laughter. I can confirm all three are useful in a long cancer journey. But to survive and truly thrive, I would need the help of others.

Years into my journey, the medication that should have kept my disease manageable didn't control the leukemia fast enough and left me with dangerously low platelets. I needed healthy cells from a stranger to replace my immune system. None of my family members or friends were a viable bone marrow match. That's when we turned to NMDP and the national registry.

My life-saving match was eventually found, and in August 2012, I underwent chemotherapy and a transplant. NMDP made my medical journey possible and successful. My medical team was stellar and compassionate. My family and friends wrapped me in love and comfort. My son made me laugh and kept nourishing my soul with his smiles.

Today, I recognize that the journey to healing is not as accessible for all as it was for me. Volunteering with NMDP allows me to work on many fronts, such as increasing and diversifying the donor registry and educating folks about cell therapy.
